

- The course is restricted to female candidates only.


HOW TO APPLY

- Duly filled forms should be submitted together with the following documents on the admission day.
 - (a) Self addressed stamped envelope (20 X 8 cm size)
 - (b) Attested copies of mark sheets of qualifying examinations (10th and 12th.)
 - (a) Ten passport size photographs
 - (a) In case of SC/ST/OBC attested copy of caste and income certificate from the competent authority.
 - (a) Proof of age
 - (a) Medical fitness certificate.
 - (a) Copy of Transfer Certificate and Conduct Certificate.
 - (a) Aadhar card



SELECTION CRITERIA

The selection of the candidate will be purely on the basis of merit. Reservation policy of the Govt. of Madhya Pradesh shall be applicable. The list of selected candidates will be displayed on the notice board and they will be informed individually by post.

OUT PASS

- Students are advised not to go for unnecessary outing as it causes wastage of their time, money and energy.
- Students can go for Sunday worship in groups to their respective churches between 7 am to 2 pm with the prior permission of the Principal at their own expenses.
- Visitors are not allowed on working days. The authenticated visitors can meet their wards once in a month with the permission of the warden in the parlour/visiting room of the hostel, visitors are not allowed to enter into the students rooms.
- Night out pass for local students will be permitted once in a month only. The application for the same should be submitted to the Principal well in advance by the parents.
 Visit to local guardian is allowed only if the guardian is staying with family in Bhopal.
- Students should submit a departure letter to the Warden before leaving the hostel and should also enter their names, time of leaving, purpose and other details in the Hostel out pass register.
- Students should be back to the hostel on the stipulated date and time after their vacations.
 Late reporting and leave without permission will cause strict disciplinary action.

DRESS CODE

Students are expected to wear their college uniform during college hours and clinical uniform during clinical hours. Students should be well dressed up in the college premises.

All parents and students are requested to follow these rules for the smooth functioning of our institution. Any clarification if needed can be made from the management.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Students are expected to follow the rules of the college and hostel strictly.
 Disciplinary action will be taken on the defaulters.
- Students are advised not to keep excess cash, jewellery and other costly items in their rooms.
- Students should strictly follow the timing scheduled for the usage of mobile phones. On weekdays the phones will be provided from 07 pm to 09 pm, on Sundays phone timing is from 02 pm to 09 pm.
- Each student is responsible in keeping the rooms clean and tidy.
- Pasting of pictures and drilling nails on the walls is not permitted.
- Students are not allowed to use personal electrical appliances.
- Students should ensure that the lights and fans are off and the taps are closed before leaving the room/wash room.
- Keep the toilets and bathrooms clean.
- Any need for repair should be reported to the Warden.
- Washing of clothes should be done only through Dhobi.
- All the hostelities are expected to take the food from the common mess. No wastage of food is allowed.
- Food will be served on scheduled time only.
- No one is allowed to take food to their respective rooms unless one is sick.
- Entry to kitchen and store is prohibited.
- Any complaints regarding food should be reported to Warden/Principal.
- Sick students should report to the Warden and send leave application signed by the Warden to the concerned Class teacher before 8 am. No students are allowed stay in the hostel during the class hours without the permission of the Warden/Principal.
- Speaking English / Hindi is compulsory in the campus.
- All students are expected to attend the evening prayers. Catholic students are expected to attend the Morning Prayer and the Holy Mass.
- Strictly follow games and recreation timings.
- Students are allowed to watch films or any programmes of their interest only on Saturdays with the permission of Warden.
- Students are not allowed to leave the college premises without the permission of the Principal/Warden.
- The following acts of "misconduct" are punishable, and can lead to expulsion from the hostel and the institution:
- Wilful destruction of the institutional property.
- Any attempts to bribing or corruptions.
- Creating confusions or intolerance on religious or communal grounds.
- Causing disruption in the academic functioning of the college.
- Threat or use of physical force against any student or staff.
- Verbal abuse on others.
- Misconduct in the term/final examinations.
- Illegal and unhealthy relationships which create scandal among the students and defamation of the prestige of the institution.
- As per the rules of UGC and INC any activities of RAGGING is punishable.
 Students who misbehave against a fresher will not be allowed to continue their studies in the college and an FIR will be filed against them in the nearest police station.
- Students are allowed to meet the visitors (only those entered in the register)
 with the permission of the Warden/Teacher in charge only. All the visitors are
 expected to enter their Names with the other details in the Visitor's Register
 kept in the office.

SUMMARY OF UGC REGULATIONS ON CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING IN HIGHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, 2009.

- PREAMBLE: In view of the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 8.05.2009 and in consideration of the determination of the Central Government and the University Grants Commission to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging.
- 2. OBJECTIVE: To eliminate ragging in all its forms from universities, deemed universities and other higher educational institutions in the country by prohibiting it under these Regulations, preventing its occurrence and punishing those who indulge in ragging as provided for in these Regulations and the appropriate law in force.
- 3. WHAT CONSTITUTES RAGGING: Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:
 - a) Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
 - Indulging in rowdy or in disciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
 - c) Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
 - d) Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
 - e) Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
 - f) Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students
 - g) Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
 - h) Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
 - Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an
 intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any
 fresher or any other student.
- 4. MEASURES FOR PROHIBITION OF RAGGING: There are a number of such measures at institution level, University Level, District level etc. Some of them that are important for students to know are as follows:
 - No institution shall permit or condone any reported incident of ragging in any form; and all institutions shall take all necessary and required measures, including but not limited to the provisions of these Regulations, to achieve the objective of eliminating ragging, within the institution or outside.
 - All institutions shall take action in accordance with these Regulations against those found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging, actively or passively, or being part of a conspiracy to promote ragging.
 - Every public declaration of intent by any institution, in any electronic, audiovisual or print or any other
 media, for admission of students to any course of study shall expressly provide that ragging is totally
 prohibited in the institution, and anyone found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging, whether actively or
 passively, or being a part of a conspiracy to promote ragging, is liable to be punished in accordance with

these Regulations as well as under the provisions of any penal law for the time being in force.

- The telephone numbers of the Anti-Ragging Helpline and all the important functionaries in the institution, including but not limited to the Head of the institution, faculty members, members of the Anti-Ragging Committees and Anti-Ragging Squads, District and Sub- Divisional authorities, Wardens of hostels, and other functionaries or authorities where relevant, shall be published in the brochure of admission/instruction booklet or the prospectus.
- The application for admission, enrolment or registration must be accompanied by an Anti Ragging affidavit signed by a student in a prescribed format and another Anti Ragging Affidavit signed by a Parent/Guardian.
 (Both these Affidavits can be downloaded from the Web.)
- Any distress message received at the Anti-Ragging Helpline shall be simultaneously relayed to the Head of
 the Institution, the Warden of the Hostels, the Nodal Officer of the affiliating University, if the incident
 reported has taken place in an institution affiliated to a University, the concerned District authorities and if so
 required, the District Magistrate, and the Superintendent of Police, and shall also be web enabled so as to
 be in the public domain simultaneously for the media and citizens to access it.
- On receipt of the recommendation of the Anti Ragging Squad or on receipt of any information concerning
 any reported incident of ragging, the Head of institution shall immediately determine if a case under the
 penal laws is made out and if so, either on his own or through a member of the Anti-Ragging Committee
 authorised by him in this behalf, proceed to file a First Information Report (FIR), within twenty four hours of
 receipt of such information or recommendation, with the police and local authorities, under the appropriate
 penal provisions.
- The Commission shall maintain an appropriate data base to be created out of affidavits, affirmed by each student and his/her parents/guardians and stored electronically by the institution, either on its or through an agency to be designated by it; and such database shall also function as a record of ragging complaints received, and the status of the action taken thereon.
- The Commission shall include a specific condition in the Utilization Certificate, in respect of any financial
 assistance or grants-in-aid to any institution under any of the general or special schemes of the
 Commission, that the institution has complied with the anti-ragging measures.
- Any incident of ragging in an institution shall adversely affect its accreditation, ranking or grading by NAAC
 or by any other authorised accreditation agencies while assessing the institution for accreditation, ranking
 or grading purposes.
- The Commission may accord priority in financial grants-in-aid to those institutions, otherwise eligible to
 receive grants under section 12B of the Act, which report a blemishless record in terms of there being no
 reported incident of ragging.
- 5. ADIMINISTRATIVE ACTION IN THE EVENT OF RAGGING: The institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed here in under:
 - The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punishment
 or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of
 ragging established in the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad.
 - The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely;
 - Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
 - b) Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
 - Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process.
 - d) Withholding results.
 - Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
 - f) Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
 - g) Cancellation of admission.

- h) Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
- Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.
- An appeal against the order of punishment by the Anti-Ragging Committee shall lie, (i) in case of an order of
 an institution, affiliated to or constituent part, of a University, to the Vice-Chancellor of the University; (ii) in
 case of an order of a University, to its Chancellor. (iii) in case of an institution of national importance created
 by an Act of Parliament, to the Chairman or Chancellor of the institution, as the case may be.
- Where in the opinion of the appointing authority, a lapse is attributable to any member of the faulty or staff of the institution, in the matter of reporting or taking prompt action to prevent an incident of ragging or who display an apathetic or insensitive attitude towards complaints of ragging, or who fail to take timely steps, whether required under these Regulations or otherwise, to prevent an incident or incidents of ragging, then such authority shall initiate departmental disciplinary action, in accordance with the prescribed procedure of the institution, against such member of the faulty or staff. Provided that where such lapse is attributable to the Head of the institution, the authority designated to appoint such Head shall take such departmental disciplinary action; and such action shall be without prejudice to any action that may be taken under the penal laws for abetment of ragging for failure to take timely steps in the prevention of ragging or punishing any student found guilty of ragging.

MBCON strongly adheres to anti-ragging policy and implements it through true spirit of actions. The management takes several timely actions including close monitoring to ensure the system is in place to meet the requirements and it is ragging free. We have an active committee to ensure the safety of students, inside and outside the campus.
